What is the SW EFC's tribal wastewater program?

Through this program, we aim to:

- Provide **training and technical assistance** to tribal communities for the prevention, reduction, and elimination of pollution.
- Enable tribal communities to comply with environmental regulations and build their technical, managerial, and financial capacity to sustainably operate wastewater infrastructure.
- Ensure that tribal communities have access to public funding to meet wastewater infrastructure needs.
- Support tribal communities in protecting both public health and the environment.

Through this program we can help tribal wastewater systems in **EPA regions 6, 7, and 8.**



What services could my system receive through the program?



Needs Assessments:

We can work with tribal communities to assess their wastewater infrastructure and capacity needs.



Training for TMF Capacity Building:

We offer a wide range of in-person and virtual training to build the technical, managerial, and financial capacity of tribal communities to protect the environment and public health.



Funding Technical Assistance:

We can assist with project planning, applying for funding, and project implementation for wastewater infrastructure projects.



Peer-to-Peer Learning:

We will facilitate P2P funding sessions and a P2P community where tribal wastewater systems can receive advice from their peers, share resources, create networking connections, and establish partnerships with other systems
